The Adult Sunday School

class will begin a seven-week series this month on the New Testament book of Jude. This little one chapter, twenty-five verse letter was written by Jude, the brother of Jesus. It has been called the "most neglected book of the New Testament." However, it is filled with vital exhortations to the church concerning "keeping the faith" and being "kept in the faith." Jude covers a wide array of theology of: evangelism and sovereignty of God, freedom and bondage of the will, angels and demons, heaven and hell, the lordship of Christ, and a sneak peak into the End Times. We invite you to join us as we study this exceptional book together during Sunday School hour!



We will be starting our New Members Class in late April. This six-week class will focus on: what it means to be the Church, core truths of the Christian faith, understanding the Bible, the Sacraments of Baptism and

## Now What?



Today is Easter Monday. Easter Sunday was a wonderful day of celebration, joy, and life!! We proclaimed the resurrection of Christ from the dead, and how He defeated sin, death, and the devil for us.

#### But, now what? What comes next?

The Apostle Paul answers this in his letter to the church in Colossae. He writes:

Pastor Steven Carlson "Therefore, if you have been raised up [and indeed you have been!] with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth. For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God." (3:1-3)

Paul is reminding Christians that the resurrection of Christ was not just a historical truth to reflect upon, but a present truth to live in! As followers of Christ, we are to continue living in the resurrection power of Christ, and to seek Him and the ways of God above all else. Just as Christ died for our sins, so also our old sinful nature is to be put to death, and our new life which is in Christ is to be lived out in His strength and power and for His glory.

Sometimes after the build up toward Easter, we can feel a bit of a spiritual let down after the triumphant Easter music fades away, and the Easter lilies begin to wilt, and the Easter crowd goes back to "normal" living until Christmas. But God would say, "Not so with you!" The "Way of the Cross" continues Easter Monday morning. Perhaps we could say, this is where is really begins for us! The spiritual war was won upon the cross, but the battles against the sinful temptations of our old nature, the world, and the devil will continue.

Paul goes on to say, "Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire and greed, which amounts to idolatry. ... in them you once walked, when you were living in them. But now you also, put them all aside: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive speech from your mouth." (3:5-8)

Every day we are to live out the death of Christ as we "crucify daily our old nature" and we are to daily live out the resurrection of Christ in our new nature. Paul writes, that we "have put on the new self who is being renewed to a true knowledge according to the image of the One who created him ... So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humili-ty, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts... Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, ... Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father." (3:10-17)

These words of Scripture preach their own message to our hearts simply by reading them! Each day, pray and ask the Holy Spirit to be at work in your life, putting sin to death, and leading you in sanctification as you walk with Jesus. As we move into these next months, look for ways to continue to grow in your faith and faithfulness in following Jesus. There will be a number of home Bible Study groups starting soon. This would be a great opportunity! We grow most in our faith, when we grow together.

God bless you in the ongoing newness of LIFE in the Resurrection of Jesus!



Applicant must submit a completed application form, a brief resume, and an essay (no longer than one typed, single spaced page) describing why they would like to apply for the scholarship and how they would put it to use.

Criteria for selection include academic achievement, community service (to Peace Free Lutheran Church and/or other community organizations, financial need, plan for use of the funds, and Christian example and character.

The Rase Scholarship committee, in consultation with the Family Representative from the Rase Family, will choose the individual they feel is most deserving of the scholarship consistent with the guidelines listed above.




#### **Congratulations Leslie!**

### Feed My Sheep DR Walk-A-Thon

On that day, people will be asked to walk 6 kilometers (about 4 miles) and get sponsors to agree to contribute either a set amount or an amount based upon the miles walked. Six kilometers was chosen because that is the average walked during just one of their weekly devotion distribution routes. There are two ways to participate. The first option, although the April 20th deadline is getting close, is if people are interested in getting sponsors and walking that day, Doug Hertlein has sponsor forms. We will provide a 6 kilometer route to begin and end at the church for your walk, or you are free to select you own 6 kilometer route. What is unique about this is that John and Mary have a good group of walkers in the Dominican Republic who would welcome sponsors in the US. Doug will have information and sponsor sheets for all of the Dominican Republic walkers for you to review and choose from if you would like to sponsor one of them. #### **Mission Trip Opportunities this summer**




# What to do:

- 1) cut out the bottom of the cup
